Curriculum and Learning

Our curriculum is developed to develop INDEPENDENCE, CURIOSITY AND COMMUNITY. We aim for all our children to be able to manage themselves and their learning, to be interested in learning and to be able to get along well with others. We have developed the following curriculum goals to ensure we offer a broad and balanced curriculum in a fun way giving children practical skills for their future. OVERARCHING GOAL

To SETTLE in and become a confident learner

6 Curriculum Goals—to be revisited throughout the year

- ◆ To **FOLLOW** instructions to make a flat bread
- ◆ To **SEW** using a running stitch
- ◆ To **CREATE** a story to be shared with others
- To PLAY an organized game with others until someone wins
- ◆ To **WRITE** for a purpose, using letters from their name
- ◆ To **MAKE** a composition from their own design







Assessment

While your child is playing in the nursery and taking part in snack and group activities their key person will be interacting with them. They will also be making observations about what your child can do and what skills we need to work on next with them.

Every half term your child's key person will publish a few observations for you to see. These are accessed via a password and only you can see your child's observations. We use the Learning Journal's system for this and it allows you to make comments and upload your own photographs from home.

PLEASE NOTE—we only publish a few each half term as we want our adults to focus on quality interactions rather than recording the moment.



Our facilitates

Flatts Nursery School is a purpose built nursery, which opened in December 1951. It has two large bases which offer lots of natural light. Within these bases we set up areas which cover all the aspects of learning and are designed for children to be able to independently access the materials and resources they need. We enhance each area with natural materials and real objects to spark children's curiosity and build this into a love of learning. In addition to our large bases, we have some group rooms which allow our children the opportunity to be part of their smaller key group, this time helps to develop their sense of community.

We have an extensive and varied outdoor area including hills, woodland and tracks for learning to ride wheeled vehicles. We also have an allotment where we grow our own vegetables and a reading shed where we love to share stories.





Our sensory room is a magical and calm place for children to explore. We have bubble tubes, projectors, fibre optic lights, an infinity mirror and a ball pit.





TRANSITION

Once you have visited nursery and have completed a registration form your child will be allocated a key person. Your child's key person will contact you to introduce themselves and to talk you through the transition period. This transition is tailored around the needs of your child. This is a valuable time where your family joins ours and we can share our thoughts together focused on your child and their needs.



Admission Procedures

To apply for a place at the Nursery School please visit in person so that you can be shown around the provision on offer. If you then wish to register your child you will need to produce his/her birth certificate and fill in a registration form. You will then be contacted the term before your child is due to start and invited to make some visits with your child to help in the settling in process.

Eligibility

2 year olds – Your child may be eligible for 15 hours free learning and childcare. This is available for families and children in receipt of certain benefits. Check the website below to see if you are eligible. Your child can start with us from their second birthday

3 & 4 year olds - All 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to 15 hours of free early education. Your child may be eligible to receive 30 free hours if you are a working parent. Check this website to see if you are eligible. Your child can join us, the term after their third birthday—see the table below.

If the child's 3 rd birthday falls between:	Entitled to a free place from:
1 January and 31 March	1 April (or the start of the Summer term)
1 April and 31 August	1 September (or the start of the Autumn term)
1 September and 31 December	1 January (or the start of the Spring term)
